Findings of Renowned Andrology Expert Dr Gert Dohle, Erasmus Medical Centre, Netherlands

- Rising loss of male fertility
- Next generation in serious trouble
- "Synthetic chemicals disrupt the endocrine system [incl. the human reproductive system] and contribute to disease and disability across the lifespan"

Last Bureaucratic Hurdle: Timing



In addition, your letter refers to the implementation plan recently finalised by the expert group on sustainable plant protection and endorsed by the Council. As you know, the plan identifies priority actions to accelerate availability of low risk pesticides and application of integrated pest management. The Commission facilitated the work of the group and, during the recent AGRIFISH Council of 28 June 2016, welcomed the plan and committed to follow up on its implementation.

In conclusion, I can reaffirm my commitment to follow up on the implementation of the abovementioned plan and to explore possible legislative options within the coming REFIT exercise.

Dear Commissioner, dear Dr Andriukaitis,

Thank you very much for your letter of 1 August 2016.

We thank you for your full agreement with our position that Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 must be adapted as a matter of urgency to allow low risk pesticides to enter the European Market as soon as possible. This serves the health interests of the consumers while completing the toolbox of the farmers.

We consider a so-called Fitness Check procedure a way to solve the internal contradictions in Plant Protection Products legislation Consumer interests are highlighted when in Preamble (35) of the Regulation it is stated that farmers should prioritize the use of low risk pesticides over chemical pesticides; yet to the contrary in subsequent articles non-chemical low-risk pesticides appear to have to follow the same lengthy and expensive procedure as conventional chemical pesticides in order to have access to the market. This is one of the causes why very few new active substances have entered the European farmer's toolbox.

EU farmers and agri-cooperatives and producers of low risk pesticides have agreed on the required minimal regulatory changes that, through a Fitness Check, can be immediately adopted. Importantly, the Fitness Check procedure can lead to a short term/temporary solution that will last until the lengthy bureaucratic process of a Refit Procedure has led to an effective result.

This decision would be in line with the Council initiative Expert Group on Sustainable Plant Protection² and the European Parliament where it is expected that a strong majority will adopt a Resolution requesting the European Commission to rid Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 of the said contradiction forthwith

According to DG Growth policy: "The European Commission considers SMEs and entrepreneurship as key to ensuring economic growth, innovation, job creation, and social integration in the EU^* . in this respect, we would like to highlight that SMEs are major producers of low risk pesticides.

Based on your positive reply to a letter of the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the European Parliamen's ENVI Committee (Attachment 1), Copa and Cogeca, European farmers and agricooperatives and IBMA, producers of low risk pesticides, now call on you to correct the contradiction in Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 forthwith.

As in the past, we are entirely at your disposal for positive and constructive cooperation in the interest of the health of the European consumer.

- The European Parliament and all stakeholders will demand adaptation of 1107/2009 to deliver LRPs in 2-3 years: priority Fitness Check that can later be integrated in REFIT review of 1107/2009
